Series: A H.O.P.E. FILLED FUTURE – PART 2 Message: Hope Filled Serving Scripture: Jeremiah 29:11-14 & Luke 10:1-2 NRSV Preacher: Rev. Dr. Anthony Hood

We continue our series of sermons connected to our 2025 Stewardship Campaign: A H.O.P.E. Filled Future: Helping Our People Engage. The focus of this stewardship campaign is helping each of you engage in biblical based stewardship of your time, talents, and treasure. Last week we explored the

stewardship of our time with the theme hope filled living. Today, we will examine stewarding our talents as we center our thoughts on: Hope Filled Serving.

As people of faith, we live each day believing that God is in control and that even the worse situations we face can be transformed for our good. Hope filled living is about holding on to hope, especially when our current situation and circumstances do not look hopeful. Hope filled living fuels hope filled serving, for if I am convinced God has a plan, then I can serve with joy even while I am enduring hardships. Hope-filled serving calls us to look beyond the circumstances we currently face, to make an investment in the future of someone else.

Stewarding a life of hope-filled service calls us to remember whom our service is truly rendered. We serve others as if we are serving Christ himself. We serve not for the recognition of what we have done – looking back once our hand is on the plow – rather, so that others might come to experience a life changing relationship with Christ. Hope-filled service consistently focuses our gaze, energy, and resources upon creating space for others to connect with Christ. When Christ urges us to pray for more laborers, it is a call to look at potential before us and to call others alongside to grasp the vision. Hope-filled service calls us live in the tension of investing in what is yet to be harvested while nurturing that which has already been harvested. Hope-filled service is a call to empty ourselves of the desire to prioritize our preferences in order to be filled with the hope of God's purpose for our more future.
