

SERMON SNIPPET:

Series: MAKING OUR REQUEST KNOWN – PART 5

Message: The People We Need

Scripture: Luke 10:1-9 & Philippians 4:4-7 NRSV

Preacher: Rev. Dr. Anthony Hood

Upon a recent visit to the doctor, Fred received some humbling news. The doctor informed him he was prediabetic. Fred had a family history of diabetes, and an uncle who had lost both legs to the disease. The doctor told Fred that with some

different life choices, he could reverse the sobering trend. Fred was faced with a choice: Transform my diet and exercise or suffer from the debilitating effects. While this story of Fred is fictional, some of you may have had a similar visit to the doctor, where you were also presented with the choice to make some changes.

Transformation is not easy, quick, nor painless because transformation requires us to sacrifice to obtain the desired goal. Transformation requires self-reflection, evaluation, transparency, and dedication. This point is particularly true when seeking to transform a church. For a church to experience the transformational impact of God Spirit, it requires people who are willing to make the sacrifice of prioritizing personal preference in order to obtain God's purpose. The reason we right a vision and mission, preach about them two to three times/year, and make them the filter for decision making, is so we can attract and invite others of like motivation. So that we might have the people we need to affect the transformation God envisions for us.

In our text, we find the follow-up to Jesus' teaching about those who are fit for service in the kingdom. Jesus can now deploy those who remain to go ahead of him, proclaiming his message. Jesus waited to make sure he had the right people who would be dedicated and committed to the charge he was preparing to give. The text states that he sends out 72 pairs of people into the surrounding towns, villages, and cities with a clear set of instructions. Do not take a travel bag or a second pair of shoes and do not get distracted talking to people on your way to your mission field. Transparent, offering a blessing of peace when you enter a home. Be a gracious guest and do not turn up your nose at meals. Jesus uses chapter 9:57-62 because he knew that if the wrong people were sent out, they would lead others to doubt the sincerity of his message. Jesus made sure to get people who had the characteristics needed to accomplish the goal. What were the characteristics? 1) A Servants Mindset, 2) Focused on the Mission.

3) Transparent, 4) Peacemakers, 5) Gracious, 6) Accountable, 7) Courageous, 8) Generous, and 9) Prayerful.

Virtual Rummage Sale Update 2024 eBay sales for 2024 totaled about \$4,976. with 166 transactions and 3 returned items. This was the highest eBay sales year since I began selling for the church in 2020 (remember that crazy pandemic situation?) 2024 proceeds were used to help fund improvements at the parsonage such as flooring, carpeting and landscaping work. As of December 31, our 5-year grand total is 643 transactions totaling \$16,485.24.
