

SERMON SNIPPET:

Sermon: SPEAKING FROM THE HEART Scripture: Psalm 19:12-14 NRSV Rev. Dr. Anthony Hood

Many of recognize our sermonic theme, for we have used it or have had it offered to us. According to The Free Dictionary.com, the idiom, Speaking From the Heart¹, is defined as, to speak or say something with deep emotional sincerity. We have used the idiom/phrase to encourage our sons and daughter to express their feelings to someone they like. We have heard it offered to us when preparing our best man or maid of honor toast during a wedding reception. It has served as wise

council when we are struggling to find the words to offer in tribute for departed loved ones. As people of faith, we too are invited to speak from the heart, yet we are also charged not simply to speak with deep emotional sincerity, but also with discernment garnered through prayerful contemplation. We are charged with the responsibility to be more mindful of what we say, how we say, and what we should left unsaid, because our words carry greater weight due to our relationship with Christ.

Many of us have probably heard the words of our text from psalm 19:14. For some, these words may seem reserved for Holy spaces, but I submit that they are guidance for all people of faith to use daily. So that the words we speak come from a heart steeped in God's transformational love, hope, mercy, healing, and joy. Psalm 19 is a psalm of praise, penned by King David, about the majesty and glory of God. David humbly recognizes his and our need for God's grace and guidance. Grace that forgives us our sins and guidance to keep us from making willful mistakes. David acknowledges the importance of aligning our words and actions. It is a crucial discipline for mature/maturing people of faith to be mindful how we talk to and about one another, along with how we talk to and about those yet to reconnect with God. Siblings in Christ, if we want to change the things that come out of our mouths, we must change the things that go into our hearts.
